



## **If Cooter Only Knew**

Redline Gauge Works recently had the opportunity to do some custom gauge work for John Schneider and his '69 Charger General Lee.

"We contacted John while on hiatus from his current shooting schedule of the hit TV series *Smallville*," says Sean Hudson, owner of Redline. "When John first acquired the car, a '69 Charger from Arizona, [Redline's] Shannon agreed to pull out the original 383 and get the car to our local painter to begin the transformation into a General Lee. We received the car, bug splats and all, fresh off the '03 Silver State Classic Challenge, where John and his navigator, Kris Gray, had piloted the General Lee to a Second Place finish in the 120-mph class."









Prior to the race, the General had just received a Gear Vendors overdrive unit, which helped them achieve an average speed of 120.0916 mph. Schneider requested a custom logo for the tach (a Restorations by Julius unit). "Since the car has a 511 Arruzza Hemi, we decided to tweak the 426 logo to 511," says Sean. "We also included a Rebel/American flag combination on the speedometer face." The white gauge faces use a blue and red-orange font based on the Rebel Flag colors.
